1. The Matthew C. Perry High School SAC met 4 times this year, as follows:

3. The highlights and major accomplishments of the SAC this year include:
 - a. Recognizing that athletics function as a key behavioral protective factor and that many students face barriers to timely medical care, we organized a 'Sports Rodeo' at the end of the 2024-2025 school year. This one-stop event will bring together medical personnel to conduct and complete sports physicals, ensuring students are medically cleared and prepared to participate in Fall 2025 athletic programs.
4. Issues or initiatives that were unresolved and recommended for completion during the next school year include:
 - a. Access to WiFi on long-haul bus trips is beneficial for supporting student success. Not all students have access to data-enabled personal devices. Many students rely on these extended travel periods for time to complete homework and stay on top of assignments. Providing reliable internet access helps bridge the digital divide, promote academic responsibility, and ensures that travel time doesn't become lost instructional time.

5. Issues forwarded to the DAC or military chain of command include: Traffic safety. While the SAC made commendable progress during the 2024-2025 school year in securing a reduced speed limit on the street in front of the MC Perry School complex, a minor accident involving a student did occur. Crossing guards remain a critical and consistent presence, but additional measures may be necessary. Request Station Safety conduct a comprehensive traffic assessment over the summer to identify and implement further improvements.
6. Other items to note: The 2024-2025 school year brought notable transitions following updated Department of Defense guidance regarding Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion (DEI) initiatives, including observance months and related student clubs. While changes required thoughtful adjustments across the school community, the SAC remained focused on fostering a welcoming and supportive environment for all students and families. Looking ahead, we are committed to finding creative, policy-aligned ways to celebrate student identity, build belonging, and strengthen community engagement.
