SUBJECT: Annual SAC Report for MC Perry High School, School Year 2025-2026

1. The MC Perry High School SAC met four times this year, as follows:
 - a. November 3, 2025
 - b. January 12, 2026
 - c. March 9, 2026
 - d. May 11, 2026
2. The SAC members were:
 - a. Rebecca Helm, teacher
 - b. Mayra Pena-Ruiz, teacher
 - c. Cat Peterson, parent
 - d. Chelsi Everhart, parent, chairperson
3. The highlights and major accomplishments of the SAC this year include:
 - a. Integration of middle school into high school
 - b. Change in the bell schedule
 - c. Supporting students whose parents were affected by government shutdown
4. Issues or initiatives that were unresolved and recommended for completion during the next school year include:
 - a. Change in bell schedule: assessment of success/need for changes at end of semester one
 - b. Safety assessment of pedestrian traffic before/after school with increase in number of kids moving to/from one building
 - c. Need for SAC member to be secretary
5. Issues forwarded to the IAC or military chain of command include:
 - a. Survey relating to sixth grade moving to high school building
6. SAC Vacancies. List any SAC positions that will be vacated at the end of the school year:
 - a. Will reassess number of SAC positions needed/available based on change in student body population. Middle and high school SACs are combining and will fill positions based on need at the beginning of next school year

7. SAC Parent Engagement. Provide an overview of parent engagement in the SAC. If there is evidence of low participation, what strategies will be used to increase parent involvement (ex: communication campaign)?
 - a. Parent involvement in focus groups specific to merger of middle school and high school were strong. However our community overwhelmingly did not want the sixth grade students to move to the high school and would have preferred for them to join the intermediate school. Many parents voiced their concerns through a base wide survey created by our SAC. The results were given to Col Rossman and then passed to Dr. Ferguson. The survey and its results were ignored. If parents make an effort to engage, but are dismissed, they will likely not reengage as their time at this school is limited. If their opinion isn't valued or even acknowledged, how can we expect them to keep participating?
8. Other items to note:
 - a. n/a
